Understanding and Applying Phlebotomy Skills and Techniques

The first (mainly theoretical) day comprises of

- The background to phlebotomy
- Health and safety in phlebotomy
- Infection control
- Informed Consent
- Anatomy and physiology of the arm
- Site selection – good and bad veins
- Complications that can arise when taking blood
- Needle stick Injuries, what they are and what to do
- How and where to correctly apply a tourniquet
- What is expected of a phlebotomist
- The importance of correct patient identification and informed consent

At the end of the first day all participants are given a multiple choice quiz to complete – and have to achieve a minimum standard to continue on to the second day.

The second (mainly practical) day will comprise of

- A summary of the most common blood tests undertaken
- A guide to common types of equipment used in venepuncture and how to use them.
- The technique of venepuncture
- The process of taking blood
- The correct use of safer sharps

The day includes a period of role play using pads attached to the antecubital fossa area, a period of one to one supervised practice using an artificial arm to improve technique and a 20 minute clinical assessment of each candidate, and upon completion of the course the participants are required to undertake a programme of home study and to produce 5 short pieces of written work.
